

AAPL DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE TULSA ASSOCIATION OF PETROLEUM LANDMEN

Phoenix, Arizona – September 11, 2022

The AAPL Board Meeting was held at the JW Marriott in Phoenix, Arizona. The following notes are only a portion of the Board Meeting. Should any member like to discuss more in detail, then please feel free to reach out to me.

AAPL By The Numbers – Membership is down from this time last year but Associates are increasing!

- At the time of this report, there are currently a little over 10,000 total members of AAPL, but membership is down roughly 6% from this time last year.
- 4,231 CPL's, RPL's, and RL's (as of 9/26/22 – compared to 4,543 in August of last year)
- Associate Memberships is up by 2.4% compared to last year and we currently have 214 Student Members.
- 48% of our members are eligible for certification but have not applied.

Education

- ***Landman Learning is finally live!!***
- ***AAPL RPL/CPL Certification Exam Review (OKC) is on October 12th-14th at the Courtyard by Marriott.*** Online Testing for Certification has rolled out! Once your application has been approved, you'll simply need to schedule a time at your local Scantron location to sit for the exam.
- I'm in talks with Robert Wilson (Field Landman Committee Chair) to bring a seminar to Tulsa.
- Renewable Energy Certificate program is on track for completion sometime in October.
- Complimentary education webinars are being held each quarter. These are not available for on-demand viewing, only live. The last webinar on July 13th (Excel) had 208 attendees.
- Keep an eye out for the latest AAPL Education Seminars – emailed periodically and found in the TAPL newsletters.
- Need Ethics Credits? AAPL has the new Ethics videos online at a low cost of \$50 per video.




